

6. Increase successful placements from street outreach





2. Implement outreach plan to ensure enhanced housing –focused case management to persons living unsheltered
3. Enhance efforts to address needs of elderly and domestic violence survivors living unsheltered
4. Coordinate Encampment Resolution efforts with cities to maximize collective impact of new funding



CoC's Point-in-Time Unsheltered Count








Category 4: **Non-housing Solutions** that can prevent or serve those experiencing unsheltered homelessness, including, but not limited to, persons experiencing homelessness coming from encampment sites.

1. Services and Services Coordination for People Experiencing Unsheltered Homelessness, per HSC 50243(e)(4) which includes Street Outreach, Safe Parking, and other services or programs

Category 5: **Homeless Management Information System (HMIS)**

(Up to 1 percent of allocation amount)

THE INTENT OF HHAP 6 IS TO REFLECT THE STATE'S PRIORITIES TO PREVENT AND EXPEDITIOUSLY REDUCE UNSHELTERED HOMELESSNESS THROUGH **HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION ACTIVITIES AND SUSTAIN EXISTING INTERIM HOUSING SOLUTIONS AND PERMANENT HOUSING SOLUTIONS**, INCLUDING LONG-TERM SUSTAINABILITY OF PERMANENT AFFORDABLE HOUSING (HSC SECTION 50243(A)). TO ACCOMPLISH THESE GOALS, HHAP 6 REQUIRES APPLICANTS TO CREATE AND IMPLEMENT REGIONALLY COORDINATED HOMELESSNESS ACTION PLANS (HSC SECTION 50240).







Non-housing

Solutions

- ❖ Street outreach
- ❖ Evidence-based engagement services
- ❖ Intensive case management services
- ❖ Assertive community treatment
- ❖ Housing navigation
- ❖ Harm reduction services
Coordination with street-based health care services
- ❖ Hygiene services for people living in encampments and unsheltered 10 individuals
- ❖ Services coordination, which may include access to workforce, education, and training programs, or other services needed to promote housing stability
- ❖ Costs that support people with lived experience of homelessness to participate in and/or provide input for regional and system planning (e.g., lived experience advisory board)

1% decrease in length of time homeless when enrolled in Street outreach, emergency shelter, safe haven and transitional housing- goal is less than 90 days shelter stays

3.66% decrease in returns to homelessness- goal is to stay at or below 5%, currently at 7%

0% increase in successful placements from street outreach to emergency shelter, permanent housing, safe haven or transitional housing-goal is to increase by 51%.






